

The Griffin Ranch and Family Historic Preservation Project

Some of you may have heard of the once huge and now very historic Griffin Ranch. Benjamin Griffin, early Fremont County pioneer and good friend of Anson Rudd, helped organize the first school in Cañon City in 1866 and developed the Griffin Ranch 14 miles south of Cañon City on Oak Creek Grade. He lends his name to a street in South Cañon where his house still stands and 6 generations of Griffins lived.




