



The society was formed in 1971 by a consortium of interested persons from Fremont and Custer Counties. There were 200 original charter members, and the name was Fremont-Custer Historical Society. In 2013, the membership is 100, with efforts to increase that, ongoing, the majority of whom are in Fremont County. The name was changed to Fremont County Historical Society. The focus is on identifying historic sites, education of the public about those sites, and preservation of endangered sites, The Society Board consists of 12, and the bi-monthly programs are presented as information about our heritage. The Society has also awarded a \$500.00 scholarship to deserving students from local schools. This has now changed into an Educational Award, for any group matching the mission statement of the Society.

The Society has been actively engaged in the Royal Gorge Regional Museum and History Center and donated the original material for the start of that valuable resource. The Society also is responsible for the various Colorado and United States Designation of Historic Sites throughout the County. Present projects include the Prospect Heights Jail restoration and Historic Designation of the Greenwood Cemetery.

The Society is cooperating with the Fremont County Heritage Commission in initiating Local Landmark Designation for deserving properties throughout the County and sponsoring/supporting the Geology Club and Stones 'n Bones Club.

The Diggin' It! displays show you some of the fossils that have been discovered in Fremont County, and an interactive computer system lets you learn more as you play the puzzles and tests.





#### HISTORY OF THE CARLSBAD NATATORIUM CAÑON CITY, COLORADO

Hot springs and mineral baths have afforded countless health benefits for centuries, and have been used to cure maladies ranging from arthritis to indigestion. Cañon City had its fame in the early 1900s to 1969 when the Natatorium was forced to close by the Health Department.

In 1904 Benjamin and Josiah Hazard drilled a well in an attempt to find oil. At 1650 feet deep, gushing artesian water rose to the surface at 700 gallons a minute, according to the Colorado Natural Resources information on wells in the Arkansas Valley. The attempt to find oil was abandoned, and the water continued to flow, developing a very large pond. Josiah and his wife Eva, lived on Pear Street, just a short way from the pool. They started construction at the end of Dozier on Central Avenue to develop the water into a swimming pool. The dimensions of the pool were described as "The Plunge" at 40' by 130'. The Hazard family actually developed the pool and promoted the company by selling stock certificates to finance the venture. (see Page 1 for Stock Certificate picture).

The complex was named the Carlsbad Mineral Baths and the Cañon City Natatorium in 1905 when the pool was enclosed in concrete. Eventually the dressing rooms, a beauty parlor, a snack bar and other amenities were added. Bathing suits were available for men, women, and children.

A company was formed in 1905 of D. J. Schambach, President; Chas. E. Tanner, Vice President; Arch McNelly, Treasurer; A. H. McLain, Secretary and J.T. Hazard, Manager. 1907 brought reorganization and certificates being issued with the following officers: Arch McNelly, President; Josiah H. Hazard, Vice President and Manager, and Arthur H. McLain, Secretary.

There is a March 1906 article in a local paper that states Dr. Pitt A. Wade, a physician practicing from the Felter Building, and living at Fairview Terrace, South Cañon, purchased the "infernal gusher" and 30 acres of land on the Hazard Ranch. He was raising chickens, with a thermal heated brooder house, as well as developing a greenhouse to raise vegetables heated by the waters. He also was using the water to heat his home. The well was producing 250,000 gallons of water a day, according to the article.

Benjamin Hazard, who had instigated drilling for oil on his 30 acres of land, died in October of 1909 in Cañon City, burial in Lakeside Cemetery. His son, Josiah took over the swimming pool management until it passed into the hands of Epperson Fulkerson. W. Ray Fulkerson was the proprietor of the Natatorium in 1929.

When Robert and May Abbott purchased the Cañon City Natatorium in 1945, swimming was a very popular way to cool off in the summer and even during the winter, the 98-degree water was pleasant and soaking was encouraged. The Mineral Water was considered good for the constitution and the body.

It took Robert and May a year of considerable upkeep and refurbishment before they opened for business. This particular timing was not the best because of the polio scare throughout the U.S. However, the following years proved prosperous for the couple. After Robert died, May remarried Marian Bowyer, who continued to run the pool. In 1969, the Colorado State Health Department determined the water was not filtered or sanitized properly, and required the pool be upgraded. Since the cost was over \$90,000, the Bowyers were forced to close down the Cañon City Carlsbad Natatorium. *Researched and written by Carol McNew, and Margaret Storm*
