## HISTORY OF THE ROYAL GORGE REGIONAL MUSEUM AND HISTORY CENTER

The Municipal Building was built in 1927 with the help of local businessman Dall DeWeese. He helped to acquire funding for the construction of the building with the condition that the second floor of the building would always be a museum. He also stipulated that the building be fireproof. with concrete floors and sturdy walls to hold large taxidermy mounts. DeWeese even designed the fireplace on the second floor that incorporates dinosaur fossils, petrified wood, minerals and a part of a stalactite. The first artifacts displayed in the museum were, of course, items collected and donated by Dall DeWeese. The world famous artist Robert Amick a native son of Fremont County, also has several paintings on display,.

Denver architect Eugene Groves designed the building. He also was the architect of the former Cañon City High School (now the Middle School), the Administration Building at Colorado State University in Fort Collins, and the American Mountaineering Center in Golden, Colorado, just to name a few. The Municipal Building is listed on the National Register of Historic Properties as well as the Fremont County Heritage Commission's Local Landmark Registry.

Today, the Cañon City Municipal Building houses the Heritage Center's exhibit galleries, program room, and research room. You will be greeted by knowledgeable docents and volunteers who will gladly assist you with your genealogical, historical, family and regional questions. 

### Old Landmark of Cañon City is Being Razed

One of the oldest houses in Cañon City, believed to be 92 years old located at 1315 River Street is being razed. Claude Dowan, owner, expects to erect a business building on the site, later.

Dowan learned that the house is on the Augustus Macon Ranch and apparently had been built by Macon. The stone and adobe structure still was in good condition.

The old well on the place is another landmark and Dowan is planning to keep it as such. It is a hand-dug well, 42 feet deep, walled up with rocks and was dug possibly three quarters of a century ago. *(Info from RGRM&HC)*
