ASHLEE SACK PRESENTS HARDY



We are pleased to have Ashlee Sack present the history of one of our most famous and active pioneers. Guy U. Hardy came to Cañon City to recover from tuberculosis at an early age. He immediately went to work for local businessmen, eventually purchased the Daily Record Newspaper, and was active throughout his life in our town, county and the State of Colorado. The story of this unusual citizen is one of dedication and community service.

ASHLEE SACK

A transplant (just like her historic muse - Guy U. Hardy), Ashlee has found the "center of her heart's geography" (Bryce Andrews, *Badluck Way*) in Cañon City. She moved from California in 2004 to work as a whitewater raft guide at Echo Canyon River Expeditions, where she subsequently met her husband, Ben. From that time, Ashlee worked as a middle school teacher at Florence Middle School, and has worked for FAR since 2015. Her greatest joy is to have adventures with her husband and two young sons.



GUY U. HARDY: The story of a gentleman from the East who improved our lives by his efforts both in the City and County. He recovered from tuberculosis after coming to this town, he married a local girl, and he raised his children here.

At the turn of the century, the federal government began establishing national parks and reserves.


In Cañon City, Guy U. Hardy fought for the establishment of three City parks: Temple Canyon Park, Red Canyon Park, and the Royal Gorge Park. Through his vision, foresight, and financial contribution to the cost of the effort, Hardy succeeded in winning these iconic properties for our community...though he never received public acclaim. The Illinois native, who served as post master, business owner, publisher of the Daily Record, Chamber of Commerce President, and Congressman, made many significant contributions to our area – those we enjoy today. The Daily Record building (pictured below as it is now) still stands as a memorial to a life.



THE PAVILION AT SODA SPRINGS: Soda Springs at the edge of town. The edifice was removed when construction of the four lane highway (Highway 50) as it went around the end of the "Hog Back" as they called Skyline Drive before there was a Drive! This iconic picture was taken from a post card sent to a local person, and it is preserved for us to admire the construction of a wonderful part of Western Cañon City.

The Guard Tower at the upper center part of the picture is still visible today and is being considered for renovation and reconstruction. The Department of Corrections will finance the very much needed improvement, and we will be certainly supportive of this effort on their part.



Cañon City is full of relics of the past and we can find them everywhere, if we just look. Each building is unique and has native stone and other local building materials, such as brick, terra cotta, lumber and design which contributes to the historic district of 81 buildings in downtown Cañon City.
