MEMORIES OF THE CAÑON CITY PRISON

As a child in the late 1950's/early 1960's, about 10 years old, my family attended a Boy Scout dinner at "Old Max" prison. The prisoners cooked and served the supper; and, we thought nothing of it. The convicts were polite and helpful. Above where we were eating, there were walkways where the guards were posted and watched all movements.

The convicts who were trustees were trustworthy and honorable in those days.

7 A.M. each and every morning, the steam whistle would blow; time for breakfast, time for school, time for work, time for church!

One escape in the early 1960's, the escapee worked his way across town to East Circle Drive. From the Odd Fellows area, he took the ditch south behind the homes. I remember the officers telling us to go into our homes and lock the doors and windows; also to make sure the car keys were not in the ignition. We just watched them as they proceeded to Franklin.

In those days, homes were left open and keys in the cars. Escapees didn't linger in Cañon City; they wanted to get out of Dodge.




