

This year is a very special year for the City of Cañon City. We are celebrating 150th, or




sesquicentennial, anniversary! Founded in 1872 Cañon City has such a vast, rich, and

The Fremont County Historical Society is fortunate to have come across a book that hasn't been included in our Historical Book Collection in quite a few years. The family of Janet Sterling found a large inventory of books printed in June of 1983, and has made *The Legends of the Royal Gorge Region* available to the Historical Society for distribution.

Janet Sterling was the mother of Jim Sterling, who was a past Advertising Editor of the *Cañon City Daily Record*. She wrote some of

this collection of stories for the *Daily Record* and other publications around the County.

She wrote:

The Cañon City region is rich in legend and history. It is one of the first explored and first settled areas of the West. Cañon City itself is one of the oldest towns in Colorado. These stories I have written from time to time as occasion arose, or whim dedicated. Most were written for the newspaper and magazine publication or for production as radio plays. I have collected them between these covers for convenience sake and for ready reference. My version of the legend of the Spanish Peaks is being published as printed herein for the first time. I dedicate this book to Cañon City, the Beautiful, the Loveliest Town in all the world, in which to live.

The *Legends of the Royal Gorge Region* has been discovered at a very convenient time. This 150th Anniversary Celebration of Cañon City's history will be the unveiling of Janet Sterling's book and will be available at the Jubilee Celebration, April 2, at Cañon City High School in the Historical Society's booth for a donation of \$5.

OAK CREEK CEMETERY PROJECT




