Changes, Postponements...

We're not going to talk about what didn't happen! Instead we'll look back at all the wonderful things that the Friends and the Museum staff have been able to accomplish in the face of extreme conditions.

The Museum was forced to close on March 15, 2020 and was allowed to reopen on April 27th for appointments only with masks, gloves, sanitizing, and contact tracing requirements. Innovation and inspiration took over. After rearranging spaces to accommodate the restricted numbers, staff was able to continue supporting their Starpoint and school programs, and Morning Line. Craft and activity events became pick-up events. Genealogy classes went virtual from City Hall. Research requests and inventories were ongoing and a skeletal group of faithful volunteers continued working in isolation. Automatic lights were installed along with automatic water faucets. And fiber optic cable finally became operational!

A State Historic Fund Grant was received to work on Rudd House drainage improvement and porch rehabilitation. With these monies, a contract has been signed and work should begin soon. A Bureau of Land Management Grant was also received to support ongoing paleontology efforts. The Friends Classic Movie Night Fundraiser was a huge success which allowed for the purchase of newspaper storage units.

2021 is holding great promise. The Friends are working behind the scenes to support the activities of the museum. The annual meeting is still in the planning as are historic cemetery and bike tours when all is deemed safe. Planning for Cañon City's sesquicentennial exhibits and celebrations as well as fund raising activities are beginning. Thank you to our membership for your continued support.

Virtual genealogy classes have continued via Zoom in 2021. The January meeting "The Weather Outside is Frightful; Adding Depth to Your Genealogy Story" focused on weather events that might have directly or indirectly impacted families. Love and Marriage were celebrated in February with a thorough examination of the various marriage records that might be found in courthouses or archives. 
Holiday Pickup Day
