

after arriving in Pueblo, Gregory immediately realized the powerful and yet untold story of the new creative economy in one of America's great industrial landscapes which was once dominated by the Colorado Fuel & Iron Company and

the Nuckolls Packing Company. Gregory is the owner of the award-winning Kadoya Gallery and since his arrival in southern Colorado has launched the Shoe Factory, the ARTery, and the Underground in the Historic Federal Building. Over the years he has lectured extensively on the history, culture and the arts of Pueblo and is best known in the region for his talks on The Tunnels of Pueblo and Steel & Meat. He is a former Board Member of the Steelworks Center of the West and now advises The Arts Academy at Pueblo County High as a creative consultant and serves as a Board Member. Gregory is currently a Commissioner on the Historic Preservation Commission for the City of Pueblo where he is an advocate for adaptive reuse of historic properties, economic redevelopment and tourism. In 2020, Gregory joined the Governor's Council on Economic Stabilization and Growth which explored the full scope of economic impacts of COVID-19 in Colorado and made recommendations to mitigate the uncertainty faced by workers, employers, their families and communities.

Anson Rudd – Blacksmith Poet

(Jean Bogeart, 1976)

Anson Rudd and his wife Harriet came to Canon City, Colorado, in the winter of 1859. Harriet had lived long enough in a covered wagon. The logs for their cabin came from the Greenhorn Mountains, south of Cañon City. It was the first home in Cañon City to have a board floor. Anson loved books and was a man of wit and learning. He brought his library with him in the covered wagon. One of Anson's interests was poetry. On many occasions he wrote a verse and was known as the Blacksmith Poet.

The following are some of Anson's poems:

And cheer our pathway thro' this earthly night.

God bless our wives, first, last, best gift to man.

The crowning beauty n creation's plan;

Our guiding star that points to heav'n above.

Where all is joy and harmony and love.

Our children, also, sparks that scintilate.

From love's bright realm where forms estatic mate.

May they be spared to cheer our varied lives

As we go journeying heavenward with our wives.






