Meridian Media, a Denver company
producing documentary and feature films.

David has edited hundreds of TV commercials and a several documentaries including the Academy Award winning short documentary *A Story of Healing* and the Gracie Award winning *The Other Angels*.

# EMRICH TO SHARE COLORADO FILM HISTORY

David has produced films for Bents Old Fort National Historic Site, Sand Creek Massacre National Historic Site and Petrified Forest National Park amongst others.

For the past 30 years he has researched and written about Colorado film history. In 1997 he wrote a book, *Hollywood, Colorado*, chronicling filmmaking in Colorado between 1897 and 1914, much of it centered in Fremont County.

He will show dozens of pictures and short movie clips about these early days. He will then show a 1912 short movie shot in Canon City, *The Dynamiters*. This may be the first time that this film has been seen in 110 years!




## **ROYAL GORGE REGIONAL BOOKS FOR SALE**




