

WESLEY BROWN: HOW THE 1959 GOLD RUSH PUT COLORADO ON THE MAP

Back by popular demand, Wesley Brown the "Maps Guy," is presenting his historic maps of Colorado.

Wes is noted for his presentation that provides a history of the discovery and exploration of the place that will become Colorado. This information is revealed on maps of the interior-west from 1540 to 1861, when Colorado was just a territory.

The story is told in six chapters: the mythical mapping of New Spain, mapping the Rio Grande valley in the 1600s, discovery of the Mississippi valley and the western plains, new Spanish expeditions from Santa Fe into Colorado in the late 18th century, official government expeditions of the early 19th century, and the 1859 gold rush that puts Colorado on the map. Today he will be talking about the Colorado Gold Rush.



In the spring of 1858, Colorado's Front Range area was uncharted and inhabited only by natives. But by the close of 1859, 100,000 fortune seekers had thoroughly explored the Front Range, north of Pueblo to the Wyoming border. In their quest for gold, they left their footprints on the landscape, establishing dozens of settlements and blazing numerous trails. This presentation will teach you about Colorado's gold rush and how this important chapter of history influenced Colorado maps of today.

Wes Brown has been a collector of old maps for forty years with special interest in the exploration and settlement of the West and Colorado from the 16th through 20th centuries. A Denver resident, he co-founded the Rocky Mountain Map Society in 1991 that continues a monthly lecture program.

Wes has served as the Co-Chairman of the national map and geography society of the Library of Congress and on the board of the Society of the History of Discoveries. He is a frequent speaker at map and history conferences and has published many papers on mas. Wes fell in love with maps at age 16 using U.S. Geological Survey maps for climbing mountains.

FLYING HIGH FOR GOVERNMENT BONDS

Bird Millman, a Canon City, Colorado girl, was a famous high wire artist. She performed in follies, vaudeville, and with Ringling Brothers Circus. Bird helped raise money for the Liberty Bond drive during the first world war. She did this by walking across a wire twenty-five (25) floors high above Broadway in New York City.

Popular Mechanics Magazine featured her on its cover in February 1917. She was

"Dancing with Death Above the Skyscrapers." Bird dreamed of walking a wire across the Royal Gorge. This was never done because of high wind blowing through the gorge.

Bird Millman died August 5, 194 0 and is buried in Lakeside Cemetery, Canon City, Colorado. She was elected to the Circus Hall of Fame, twenty-one (21) years after her death. Bird was the "foremost female wire-walker in show business history."







ROYAL GORGE REGIONAL BOOKS FOR SALE




