


about Loretta nurturing a damaged butterfly. She named him Edgar. When Edgar passed, she even wrote an obituary for him!

Annual Meeting

Members and guests attended the Friends of the Museum annual meeting on February 3rd. After a short business meeting conducted by chair Gerrie Colette, Deb Hildebrand and Shari Mohr returned to entertain and inform us about more cattlemen, cattle ranches and cowboys in the local and

surrounding areas. Deb emphasized the importance of each of us sharing our stories with our families and with our local history center. Without these records, we wouldn't have the stories about Bic Miller, the Eddy Brothers, the John Burnett Ranch, and so many more. Shari regaled us with stories about double roped cattle and small loop roping, how longhorns hide in the brush during the day, and Albert







were born. We were introduced to the Elkhorn Ranch which existed prior to 1860, changed hands numerous times and was in the Hayden family from 1872 to 1933. We heard the antics of Frederick Koch who rode his horse up to the bar and shot the pipe out of the bartender's mouth. Shari also recounted the industriousness of Frederick Raynolds who came to Cañon City to open a bank, established the Raynolds Cattle Company and became the largest real estate owner in the county. Upon his death, his wife Magdelaine Sheetz Raynolds assumed his business interests and became the first female president of a bank. Our many thanks to Deb and Shari.

Coffee and Conversation

807 Cyanide was the discussion at February's Community Coffee. This was the location of two well-known and well-loved restaurants of Cañon City's past: Sali's Club Paradise & Janey's Chili Wagon.

Gus and Doris Salardino owned and operated "Sali's Paradise," from 1945-1984. Memories were shared of the building itself and the décor including headshots of famous visitors, Super Bowl banners from games Gus and Doris had attended, and even leprechauns painted on the bathroom walls! People remembered a feeling of community amongst patrons, and of the kindness and generosity of Gus and Doris. Another common thread memory was their famed minestrone soup.

Gus passed away in 1984 and the business continued under different management for another six years. The next business to move in to this iconic location would be "Janey's Chili Wagon."

Janey had been a single mom working as a waitress all over the country. She had always dreamed of owning her own restaurant and she found that opportunity in Cañon City. Her first location was 315 Royal Gorge Blvd. Retired chiropractor Joe Ashton shared that he and Janey opened their businesses at the same time, Janey opened on Saturday, Dr. Ashton that Monday. That was 1976.

When Janey started her business she was 55 years old, the Chili Wagon was open 6am-9pm seven days a week, and Janey worked all positions! Janey's hard work paid off and as her client base grew, thankfully, so did her staff. In 1981 Janey's Chili Wagon moved to the carriage house at the Robison Mansion where it would remain for a decade. In 1991 the Chili Wagon moved again, this time, filling the spot that was once, "The Paradise."

Chris Jenkins also attended the coffee. A few years back Chris created a wonderful video on this very topic which can be viewed on the Royal Gorge Regional Museum & History Center's You Tube Channel, titled "Sali's Club Paradise & Janey's Chili Wagon."


