Greenwood Cemetery: A Stroll Into History

This will be an ongoing story of those residing at this historic cemetery. Here are their stories.

William Catlin, 1827-1896

William donated 10 acres of land that became the Greenwood Cemetery. Catlin along with Rudd and Helm paid \$300 in 1867 for a load of fruit trees. They were to come to Canon City by way of a prairie schooner. This load did not survive the trip. The men were not defeated although it took several years for fruit trees to become established. By 1976 William established apple trees in Lincoln Park despite loss of the trees by freezing and rabbits.

Joseph Maupin, 1856-1929

Joseph was a building contractor most noted for building the Canon City Post Office Block at 5th and Macon in Canon City. The post office block still stands. In 1892 Maupin was the Democratic nominee for the governor of Colorado. However, he did not will the election.

Milby Smith, 1794-1877

Milby crossed the plains of the west by ox train in 1860 at the age of 52. He was a veteran of the Mexican American War and also fought in the Civil War when he was 67 years old. During his life time he saw the invention of railroads and trains, photography, telegraph and Morse Code, and the telephone.

Robert Amick, 1879-1969

Robert was born on a ranch near Canon City, Colorado. During his life he was a painter, illustrator, and teacher. He specialized in paintings of early western history. He donated seven lithograph copies of his work to the Royal Gorge Regional Museum and History Center. These works of art can be seen at the museum.
