## MUSEUM OF COLORADO PRISONS


I have always been interested in history, and how the stories of people make history. So the perfect job for me is the Museum Administrator of the Museum of Colorado Prisons for the past 12 years.

As usual we continue to search for volunteers to help spread our history of Fremont County. If you enjoy research, meeting new friends, or planning parties talk to us! We can fill up your time.






