Caleb Richtner and Cinde McPhail "Heritage Apples"


- Caleb Richtner -


Born and raised in Fremont County, Caleb always had an interest in plants. Growing up he remembers fondly playing in the old, neglected orchard near his Grandpa's house in Lincoln Park. His interest in plants led him to do many gardening and farming projects in the local 4H club. Some of these included growing many types of ornamental plants for bouquets and arrangements and planting and mixing medicinal herbs to make homemade teas. His passion for fruit trees really took off when he began helping local entrepreneurs Mario and Albert DiNardo with their orchards. From them he learned that Fremont County was a special place with a unique heritage of fruit growing. Our area offers superb climatic conditions for the cultivation of fruits, and has had a long history in that industry.

For over 20 years he has been learning, pruning, planting, and sharing the fruits from this labor of love. Caleb lives in North Canon City with his Mother where he enjoys planting more trees for the future.

My grandparents purchased the Howard, Colorado, Amy Homestead in 1942 partially because of the old orchard that was still thriving there. Our family has attempted to keep the heritage trees alive, and more recently to share their genetics and their produce with others interested in promoting them. Grafting classes in the spring with local varieties offered is one of the ways this is done. I support the Montezuma Orchard Restoration Project (MORP) by locating, mapping and DNA testing old heritage apple trees in the Fremont County area as well.






ROYAL GORGE REGIONAL BOOKS FOR SALE
